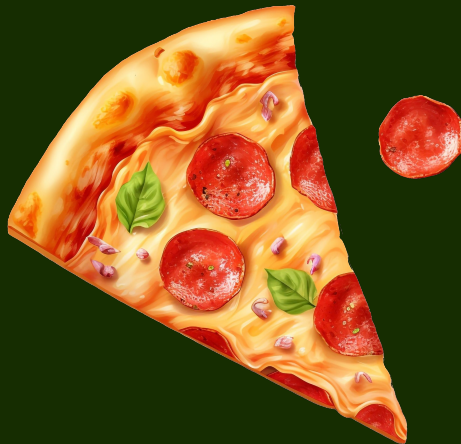

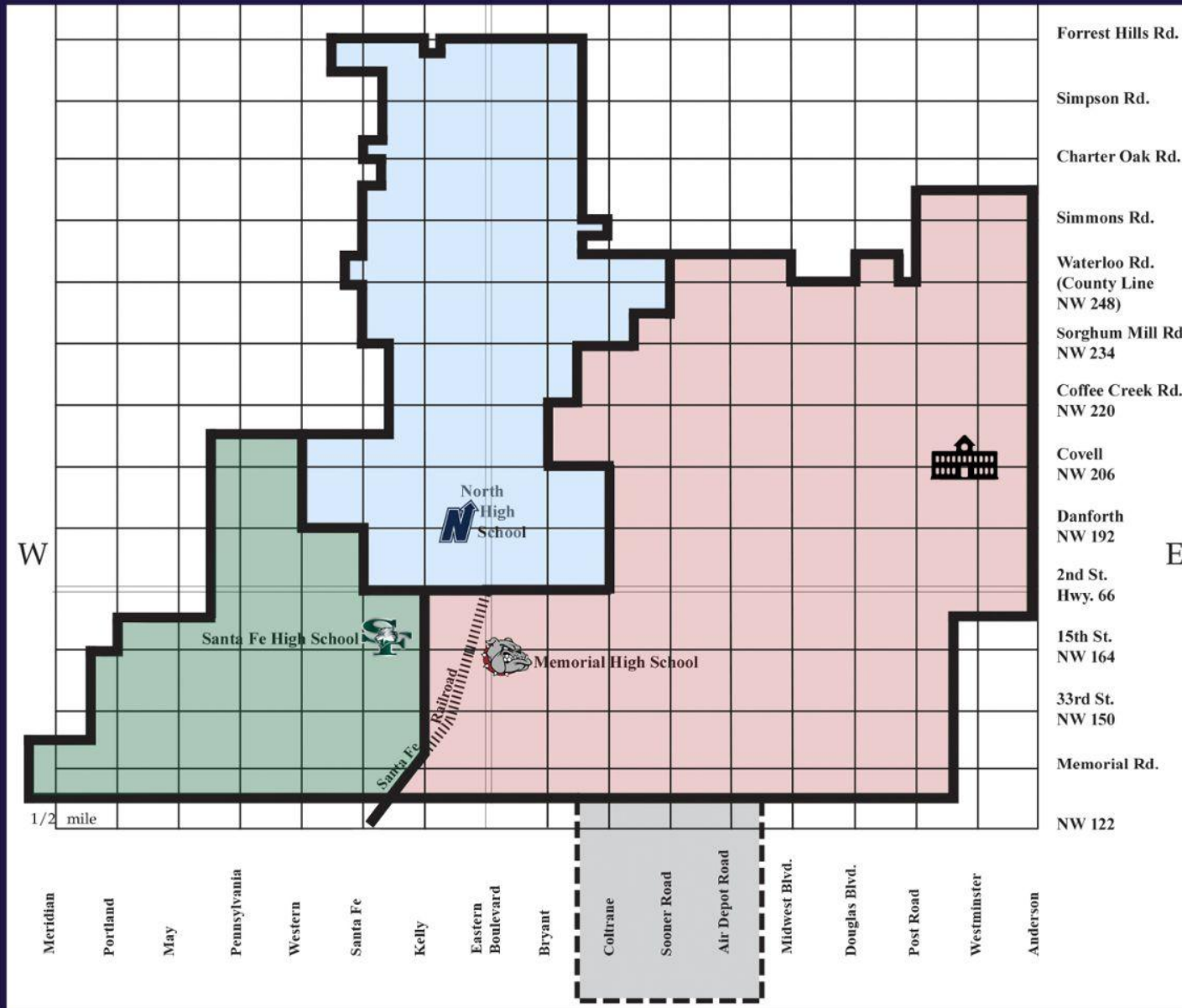


Highlights

Highlights

Transition Academy Building

(Projected to expand from 16 students in 2023-24 to 48 in 2025-26)

- ETA serves our students who are between 18-21
- Objective is to prepare these students to live self sufficient lives by teaching life skills (budgeting, cooking, cleaning, laundry, etc)
- These students receive both classroom instruction and are placed in internships throughout the community
- EPS continues to see an increase in Special Education students (up approximately 100 students since October 1st)

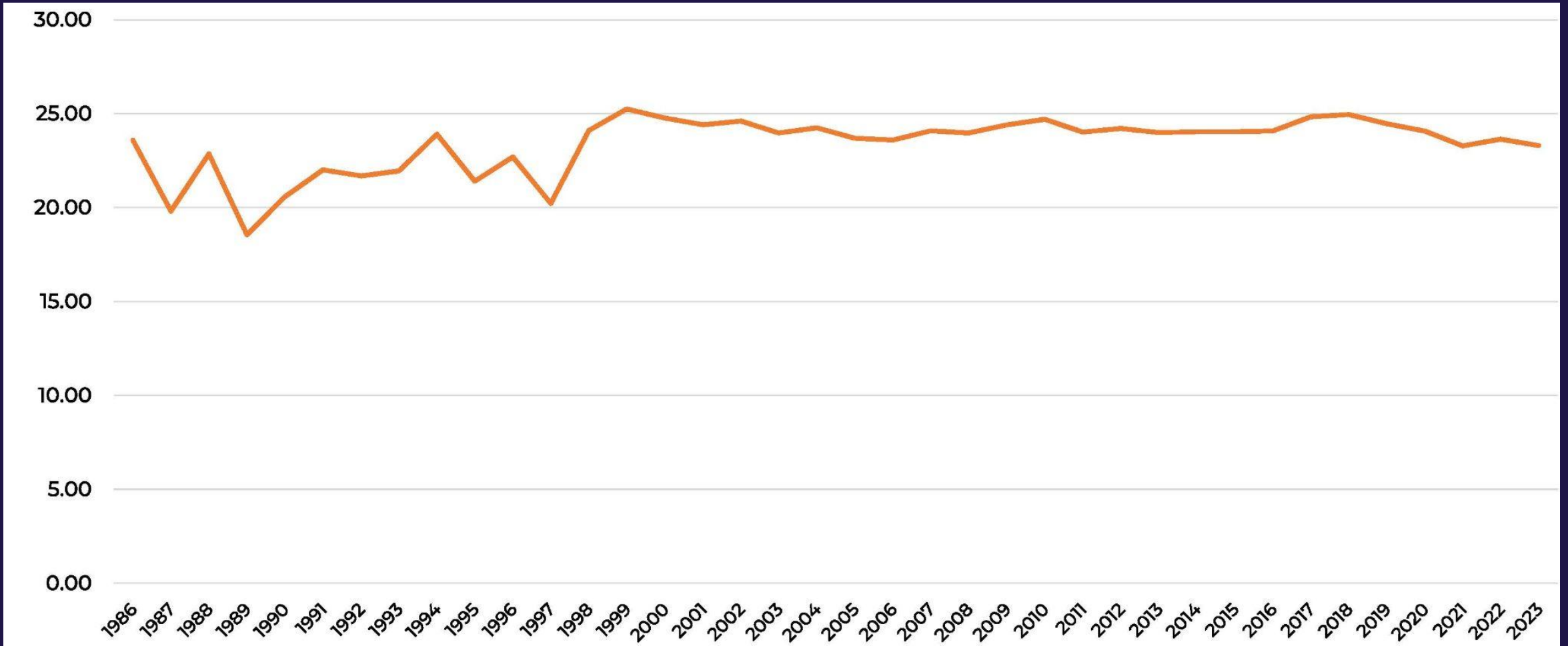

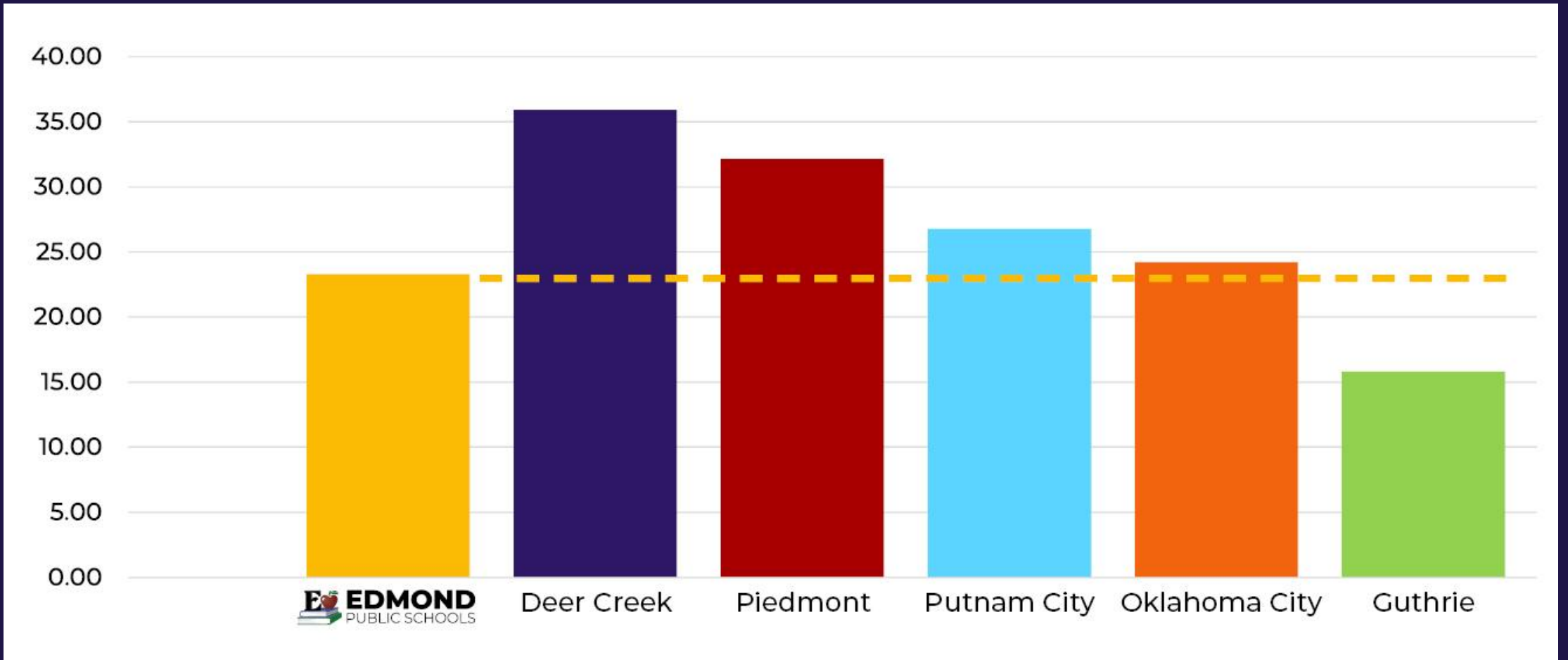
Other Important Factors
